FREEDOM + FREEDOM

This past week we celebrated the 4th of July which is also known as Independence Day. Many of us know the basic facts we learned in school: we fought King George III's army of British Redcoats to gain our freedom and, we learned how George Washington led our Army to victory. We wanted our freedom because we were tired of "taxation without representation".

Some interesting facts about the 4th:

56 men signed the Declaration of Independence which was approved by the Second Continental Congress on the 4th of July, and was signed on August 2, 1776. Two of the signees became President: John Adams and Thomas Jefferson. Both of these men died on July 4, 1826.

It is believed Betsy Ross sewed the first American Flag-designed by Francis Hopkinson-commissioned by General Washington.

The design of the flag is symbolic: 7 red and 6 white stripes represent the 13 colonies. The white color symbolizes "purity and innocence" the color red symbolized "hardness and valor" the color blue stands for vigilance, perseverance, and justice. The 13 stars were originally sewed in a circle to represent each colony, no matter the size of each individual colony the stars were of equal size.

Frances Scott Key wrote the "Star Spangled Banner", after he watched the British bombarding the American Army on night, and saw when the smoke had cleared, the American Flag was still proudly waving in the breeze. This inspired his poem, which he wrote in 1814 and later was set to music becoming our national anthem.

As we celebrated this last week, let us first and foremost remember Our True Freedom is in CHRIST. Galatians 5:1 "Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free". Thank YOU, Jesus!

ARTICLE V-DUTIES OF TRUSTEES
