So with the question: "What do you know about Angels?", I decided I will try to find answers for myself.

Beginning in the Old Testament, I read Angels spoke to the prophets, and gave them directions about what to do. He appeared to Moses in a flame of fire which was in a bush. He appeared to Nebuchadnezzar in a dream; appeared to Danial while praying; remonstrates with Balaam; appeared with Hagar and told her to go back to Sarai and submit to her, and the Lord would bless her exceedingly. In the New Testament we read of many incidents of Angels in peoples lives. When the beggar died (Luke 16:22) he was carried by the Angels into Abraham's bosom. Matthew 28:2 an Angel of the Lord descended from heaven, came and rolled back the stone. Again many stories in the New Testament speak of Angels being evoked in peoples lives. Five Prayers of a Senior Adult in Church

I share a lot of my thoughts in the bulletin each week about scripture, culture, church and other topics, but from time to time I run across the ideas of someone else that I'd like to share with you or expand on. Four of these five main points came from Thom Rainer, author of *I Am a Church Member*. (Original Article at http://thomrainer.com/2016/07/five-things-pray-will-not-senior-adult-church/) He intends these prayers for seniors, but some of them apply to all of us.

- *I pray I will not feel entitled because I am a key financial supporter in the church.* The size of our contributions may buy influence in political parties or charity organizations, but it should never be that way in church. Our contribution is an offering to God with no strings attached.
- *I pray I will not say "I've done my time" in the church.* The Christian life is one that is intended to extend into eternity. The young can learn a great deal from the senior Christians among us and can benefit from the opportunity to be mentored by them. They can learn how to mature as Christians by watching it happen.
- *I pray I will not be more enthused about potlucks and receptions than ministry and service.* Our fellowship time together is an important part of being the church, but it's not the only part. Fellowship encourages people who are already here, but we must still take the gospel to a community who needs it desperately.
- *I pray I will not be more concerned about my preferences than serving others.* Part of being a Christian is seeing the needs of others above our own needs. We cannot assume that everyone has the same preferences that we do, and we must remember the needs of those we are trying to reach.
- *I pray I will not have a critical spirit.* When church topics are discussed, are your first thoughts positive or negative? When a new program begins or a change is made do you find others to encourage and thank the organizers for their efforts, or do you seek out people to complain to and attempt to undermine church leaders? As Rainer said in his article, "I don't want to grow old and cranky; I want to grow old and more sanctified."

Our seniors here at the Eugene Church are an essential part of our family and a blessing to our lives. Like all of our family, I pray that we are constantly Growing, Working, Sharing...TOGETHER. — Brian


