Second Sunday in October — A note about upcoming Preacher & Clergy Appreciation Day, Oct. 8

The call to honor our church leaders' contributions can be traced back to Paul. In establishing the first Christian churches, Paul advised the congregation to give "double honor" to the elders of the church who managed the affairs of the church well, "especially those whose work is preaching and teaching" (<u>1 Timothy 5:17</u>). Paul further urged Christian communities to acknowledge those "who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you," holding these spiritual leaders "in the highest regard in love because of their work" (<u>1 Thessalonians 5:12-13</u>).

On a daily basis, clergy members prepare weekly messages and nurture the spiritual well-being of their congregants. Aside from daily duties, clergy members participate in the highs and lows of the lives of their church-goers and other members of the community—baptisms, weddings, funerals, counseling, bible study, praying over sick, and more. They bear the emotional pressure heaped upon them by disgruntled congregants and also absorb the hostile criticism of an increasingly rebellious, gossipy, self-promoting and anti-religious society.

Ways to celebrate and honor those who faithfully serve our congregation:

- 1. Send appreciation cards or hand-written notes with messages of personal gratitude.
- Children can draw pictures or create other artwork to show support for Elders, Preacher, or Sunday School teachers
- 3. Gift of time —intentionally volunteer in some way to help share the load where possible
- 4. Group photo of church-goers capturing a moment in time
- 5. Thank you baskets filled with favorite things
- 6. Hugs, gift cards, or anything you can think of to show support and offer encouragement

Parenting Workshop— RSVP with Torie


